Response to Information Request

Morning Calm Management has submitted an application for minor amendments to the Capital Office Park Detailed Site Plan 84095-04. The proposal consists of installation of brick pavers over the existing asphalt parking area to delineate a tenant activity and community area, the construction of a permanent three-season pavilion structure, and associated outdoor seating amenities.

The proposed area is adjacent to Ivy lane and the Ivy Lane entrance drive to building 6404. Existing landscaping and buffer area will be maintained. The pavilion structure will primarily consist of movable glass walls and a standing seam metal roof.

Staff recommends approval of DSP 84095-04 subject to two conditions designed to improve pedestrian access to and from the new community tenant area.

12. Draft State Consolidated Transportation Program, FY 2018-2023

Excerpts from Draft Consolidated Transportation Program, FY 2018-2023

The City has received the Draft FY 2018– 2023 Maryland Department of Transportation Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP). Staff attended a staff level review session with County and State representatives on October 19, 2017. The annual tour meeting is scheduled for November 2, 2017 at 2:00 p.m. at the County

Administration Building in Upper Marlboro

The FY 2018 – 2023 CTP totals \$14.7 billion, compared to \$14.4 billion in last year's program. In summary, \$468 million worth of new projects have been added to the CTP. For Greenbelt, significant program changes include the removal of the Full Interchange at Greenbelt Metro Station from the construction program with funding diverted to another project, allocation of planning funding for the Baltimore-Washington Superconducting Maglev project, and allocation of planning funding for a study to look at improvements to the I-495 Capital Beltway to alleviate congestion. Despite the MD-193 Greenbelt Road Streetscape Project being a transportation priority of the County and the City, the project continues to not be included in the CTP.

Staff recommends City Council transmit a letter to Transportation Secretary Pete Rahn, stating the City Council's opposition to the removal of the Full Interchange at Greenbelt Metro Station project from the Construction Program. As well as state the City's opposition to the SCMAGLEV project and to projects associated with the widening of I-495 Capital Beltway due to environmental and neighborhood impacts. Staff also recommends City Council request the MD 193 Greenbelt Road Streetscape Project be added to the CTP.

The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) has identified three potential alignments for a proposed Superconducting Maglev Train between Washington DC and Baltimore, Maryland. Two of the three proposed routes run directly through Greenbelt.

Council discussed this matter at the Regular Meeting on October 9 and met with representatives of Baltimore Washington Rapid Rail (BWRR) on October 11. A draft letter opposing this project is

presented for Council review and approval.
