SUMMARY OF JANUARY 10, 2024 WORK SESSION OF THE GREENBELT CITY COUNCIL AND THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT AND BUILDING SERVICES

Mayor Jordan started the meeting at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was held on the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 25 Crescent Road, and virtually via Zoom.

PRESENT WERE: Councilmembers Danielle P. McKinney, Jenni A. Pompei, Rodney M. Roberts, Kristen L. K. Weaver, and Mayor Emmett V. Jordan. Councilmember Silke I. Pope was absent.

STAFF PRESENT WERE: Josué Salmerón, City Manager; and Shaniya Lashley-Mullen, Deputy City Clerk.

ALSO PRESENT WERE: Millard House II, Superintendent; Dr. Charoscar Coleman, Chief Operating Officer; Dr. Douglas Strader, Chief Accountability Officer; Shawn Matlock, Director of Capital Programs; Prince George's County Public School (PGCPS); and others.

Mr. House reported on leadership changes in Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) and introduced a 90-day strategic plan focused on equitable education, safety, operational efficiency, and family engagement. Key budget priorities include staffing, academic innovation, student and staff wellbeing, and school safety, along with improvements for crossing guards. He addressed school overcrowding concerns, citing a shortage of bus drivers and an upcoming transportation audit. Mr. Matlock discussed the 2017 Comprehensive Plan and temporary arrangements for students during renovations. Ms. Pompei emphasized the need for better communication and infrastructure during transitions. Mr. House recognized the importance of functional facilities and ongoing support for diverse communities, and mentioned school boundary shifts due to the 2022 Comprehensive Boundary Initiative.
