Otherwise, the holiday has been granted as a “floating day” that employees may use whenever they wish during the remainder of the fiscal year. Since Christmas falls on a Thursday, it is recommended that Council grant a floating holiday to employees. Approval of this item on the consent agenda will indicate Council’s approval of the recommendation.

12. Parking Regulations for Electric Vehicle Charging Stations at the Municipal Building

Suggested Action: An amendment to the City's parking ordinance is proposed to designate EV charging spaces as restricted-use for actively charging vehicles only. The draft ordinance is included for Council discussion. City Manager proposes this item for discussion and future adoption.

13. Stop Sign Camera Request for Proposal (RFP) Update

Suggested Action: Staff will provide an update on the Stop Sign Camera Request for Proposal (RFP), including information on the RFP process, the status of the new study, and potential vendor selection.

14. Legislative Support Services Contracts Approval

Suggested Action: City Council provided direction to pursue a multi-contractor approach for legislative advocacy and tracking for state and county legislation. Staff recommends that Council authorize the City Manager to execute these contracts or a substantially similar agreement in a form as reviewed and approved by the City Solicitor. Staff further recommends that we engage Carrington & Associates for state legislation and LA Perez, LLC for Prince George's County legislation, as described in the attached memo.

15. Approval of Legislative Priorities

Suggested Action: Based on the feedback from staff and Council input and a review of previously supported/funded Bond Bill projects, staff recommends that putting forth the following two projects for 2026 Bond Bill consideration: 1) Buddy Attick Park Walking Trail and Stage (\$300,000) and, 2) Schrom Hills Park Athletic Field Lights (\$400,000).
